Math Baseball: Multiplication

This two-player game is a fun way to practice multiplication facts! Get your dice, buttons, and put on your thinking cap because it's time to play ball!

Steps to Success

- 1. You and your opponent must each choose four buttons to serve as game pieces.
- 2. Place your pieces in your respective dugouts on the Baseball Game Board.
- 3. The youngest takes the first turn, rolling two dice.
- 4. Multiply the two numbers. Use the Scoring Chart to determine whether you've hit a single, double, triple, or home run!
- 5. Move your button to the appropriate base on the baseball diamond.
- 6. Use tally marks to keep track of your runs and outs on the Tally Chart as you play.
- 7. Move your button game piece around the baseball diamond. Keep rolling and moving your pieces around the baseball diamond until you get three outs. Next it is your partner's turn.
- 8. When each team has gotten three outs, the inning is over.
- 9. Record your final score for each inning on the scoreboard.
- 10. This game will last four innings.



Scoring Chart

36 = home run (score a run)

 $26-35 = \text{triple (go to } 3^{\text{rd}} \text{ base)}$

 $16-25 = \text{double (go to } 2^{\text{nd}} \text{ base)}$

 $6-15 = \text{single (go to } 1^{\text{st}} \text{ base)}$

5 or less = out (record an out)
