


Skip Counting by Twos


Skip count along the path by twos to get help the squirrel get to the acorns!













## **Counting Cup or Pages**


Print out this page and cut out the squirrel below. Use a glue dot or transparent tape to attach the squirrel to the back of a transparent cup. Then, use the cup to count real nuts or use the paper acorns on the next page. You might even print multiple copies and write a number on the squirrel's tale. Kids can practice counting, addition, subtraction, or multiplication using the squirrels and acorns.
